#### NPU-M VOTING RULES per 2022 Bylaws

Eligible members shall be any person 18 years of age or older whose primary place of residence is within the NPU-M designated area or a representative of any corporation, organization, institution, or agency which owns property or has a place of business or profession within NPU-M designated area (Article II, Sec. II.1). All eligible members shall have one (1) vote without attendance requirements, dues payments or any other limitation (Article IV, Section IV.1).

## MATTERS FOR VOTING

NPUs provide recommendations to the City of Atlanta by voting to support or oppose applications. The application and the NPU's recommendations, along with Staff recommendations, are then considered by the appropriate board, association, commission, or office.

#### **Design Awards 2022 - NPU Voting on Community Design Awards**

The Community Design Awards are a way for the NPU to recognize the buildings, public spaces, events, art, organizations, etc. that make your community a better place to live. Examples of previous Community Design Award winners include: neighborhood events, community organizations, new buildings, public art programs, individuals or organizations who have made a significant contribution to a neighborhood, public agencies working in that part of the city, etc. Based on the nomination's location, each nomination received was assigned an NPU for voting purposes. There can only be one Community Design Award winner from each NPU regardless of the number of nominations. The NPU may also decide that none of the nominations warrant a Community Design Award.

Nominations can be made from the floor regardless of whether there were any nominations submitted ahead of time to the Dept. of City Planning.

## **Campaigning by Elected Officials & Candidates**

Campaigning at NPU meetings is strictly prohibited by the City of Atlanta's Code of Ordinances.

#### Sec. 6-3019 Prohibition of Political Forums

"Neighborhood planning unit meetings shall not be used for political forums or campaigning for city, county, state, or federal elections."

Examples of campaigning could include, but not be limited to:

- Introduction of elected officials as political candidates in upcoming elections;
- Distributing campaign materials and literature; and
- Conducting either of the above in City Hall, its rooms or offices.
