<u>23-0-1167</u>

An Ordinance by Councilmembers Keisha Sean Waites, Byron Amos, Andrea L. Boone and Michael Julian Bond authorizing The Mayor or his designee, to rename Bell Street, SW to Leonard Tate Street, SW; to waive certain provisions of Section 138-8 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances; and for other purposes.
